Anyone got an Allen Key?

"Why should all the big-name shows have their Tasmanian Premieres in Hobart? Why not Launceston once in a while??"

With those questions in mind, Encore Theatre Company set about finding a big name show to make its Tasmanian debut in Launceston. And they found it in the only Australian musical to have ever conquered Broadway... The Boy from Oz.

But if you're going to have big dreams, then you are going to need big supporters to make those dreams a reality. And with a dream of presenting something stunning, Encore made their case to Launceston City Council to support bringing an amazing set here, complete with great technology and volunteer teachers.

And come the last weekend in July, Warehouse One at Coats Patons exploded with much activity as Encore hosted a very special guest: Grant Alley, President of CLOC Musical Theatre Melbourne (pictured bottom right with Encore Co-Presidents Jamie Hillard and Belinda J King).

CLOC is arguably the premiere amateur musical theatre company in Australia, having won some 99 Theatre Guild Awards and been responsible for the non-professional Australian premieres of many shows including Les Misérables, The Boy from Oz, Sweeney Todd, and soon Dusty (The Dusty Springfield Story).

Grant built CLOC's The Boy from Oz set, which has already featured in seasons in Melbourne, the Gold Coast and Far North Queensland, and volunteered part of his Tassie holiday (please don't tell his daughter in Hobart!) to teach Encore how to assemble the 6 tonnes of set that arrived at Coats Patons, show them how to make a 700kg grand piano 'dance' and test some 22,000 lights.

According to Encore Co-President Jamie Hillard, "Community theatre is built upon volunteers, from the director to the performers, the stage crew to the ushers. Their goodwill and generous sharing of their time and expertise make local theatre not only possible – it makes it thrive. Our local team was very excited about soaking up the knowledge that Grant freely gave for not only our current show, but we set about picking his brains about our future productions, too."

Alan Gray, Encore's Technical Advisor agrees, "I've worked with virtually every local theatre company in Launceston for more than two decades and not seen anything like this technology used here. Honestly, I feel like a big kid who has been set loose in my dream playground."

Encore Theatre Company gratefully acknowledges the generous sponsorship support of Launceston City Council to assist with hire and bringing the set here, and the team at Watkins Removals & Storage Launceston for saying "yes, we can solve that" to every silly question they could think of regarding shipping a 40 foot container to Tasmania filled with everything from palm trees to the Sydney Opera House.


Don't let the winter ills ruin your time on stage!

Eat lots of veggies - if you are bad on these make your own veggie soup and chuck in the fresh garlic and ginger to keep yourself well. If you have a juicer, make up some carrot, celery and parsley juice each morning. Throw in an apple or a couple of strawberries to improve the flavour. This juice is good for the liver and immune system.


Encore in 2011

The venues are booked and the rights are confirmed.


